



## Terenga 6: Hōtaka 11 - Tūāhua/Tūmahi + haere

### He Mihi

Kei ngā poupu o te whare kōrero o Ako, tū tonu mai rā hei whakairinga awhero, me kore noa e rere māori noa tēnei reo ki roto ki ngā kāinga me ngā hapori o te motu.

### Hei Mahi Whakarongo

Kua aua atu te kuia i roto i te kiriata poto o te rā nei e whakaako ana i ngā taura e ngākaunui ana ki te reo, i Te Wānanga Takiura, i Tāmaki nei. Me kore ake te momo i a ia, e rangona tonuhia nei te rere Māori o te kupu, te hōhonu o te whakaaro i roto i te kupu ruarua. Anei ngā pātai hei whakautu mā koutou:

- 1) He aha tētehi atu kupu mō te 'uho'?
- 2) He aha te uho o ana kōrero?
- 3) He aha ngā momo reo?

Kia whakarongo ake tātou ki te reo o te kuia māriri nei, nō Ngāi Tūhoe, o Kaa Williams.

### He Whakamārama

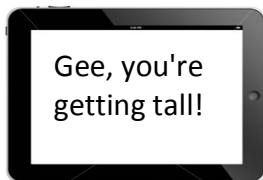
Ki te piri te kupu 'haere' ki muri i tētehi tūāhua, he tohu tēnā kei te panoni te āhua o te mea e kōrerotia ana. Tirohia ngā taura kei raro iho nei:

- a) Kua pakeke **haere** ngā whakaaro o taku tama. *My son's becoming more mature in his thinking.*
- e) Kua teitei **haere** te pātītī. *The grass has grown taller.*

Ki te piri te kupu 'haere' ki muri i tētehi tūmahi, he tohu tēnā kei te mahia taua mahi i te kaimahi e haere ana. Anei ētehi taura:

- i) Kei te tangi **haere** ngā kuia ki runga i te marae ātea. *The elderly women are crying as they enter the courtyard.*
- o) I hīkoi **haere** te whānau i te tāone. *The family walked around town.*

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### Hei Mahi

Whakamāorihia ēnei rerenga:

1. It's getting dark.
2. I'm getting tired of this.
3. He was crying as he left.
4. The old lady wept as she approached the coffin.

### Whakautu:

Mahi ĩpapa: *Wī, kei te tāroaroa haere koe!*

Hei Mahi:

1. Kei te pōuri haere.
2. Kei te hōhā haere au i tēnei.
3. I te tangi haere ia i a ia ka wehe.
4. I tangi haere te kuia i a ia e whakatata ana ki te kāwhena.
