- 3) He aha ngā momo huarahi i whāia ai e puta ai he oranga ki te iwi?

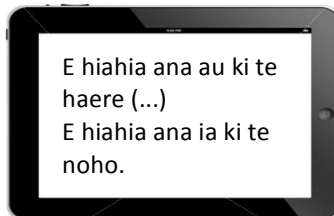
Kia whakarongo rā ki te hou mataaho o Parihaka, o Taranaki me ana kōrero mō te oranga o tana iwi.
